## Is music a peacemaker in your life?

Tell us about it and you may be eligible to **win a guitar and lessons** – even if you have never played a note or plucked a string!

The 2020 Grant A Guitar Scholarship is NOT a skills-based contest.

Submit an essay in the month of April on how music serves as a peacemaker in your life and you may be this year's recipient of the Grant A Guitar scholarship.

(At least) one high school student will receive a guitar and lessons worth \$1,000, one middle school student will receive a guitar and lessons worth \$500, and **new in 2020** one student member of Chagrin Falls Park Community Center will receive a guitar and lessons worth \$500.

How to submit an essay?

Submit an original essay (no longer than 500 words) on this year's theme: How does music act as a peacemaker in your life? Email your essay to [Entry2020@grantAguitar.org](mailto:Entry2020@grantAguitar.org) any time in the month of April, 2020.

Am I eligible?

The Grant a Guitar scholarship is available to any fulltime student currently enrolled in one of the participating organizations in the month of April 2020. This year's participating high schools are Chagrin Falls High School, Kenston High School, Orange High School, Solon High School, and Aurora High School. This year's participating middle schools are Chagrin Falls Middle School, Kenston Middle School, Ballard Brady Middle School, Solon Middle School, Orchard Middle School and Harmon Middle School. Any child eight years of age or older who participates in programs hosted by Chagrin Falls Park Community Center in April 2020 may also submit an essay.
